History of Partnership

The House Democracy Partnership (HDP)¹ approved a legislative strengthening partnership with East Timor in 2006. The partnership focuses primarily on supporting the creation of a new parliamentary research service, integrating information technology into parliamentary operations, and encouraging greater legislative oversight and efficiency. HDP also authorized an expenditure of \$175,000 to build and outfit a parliamentary library to improve the parliament's capacity for research and analysis and an additional \$175,000 project to improve the information and communication technology infrastructure of parliament.

• MPs have participated in seminars with a focus on committee structures and processes, public hearings, legislative drafting, oversight, and constituent services.
